

## Frequently Asked Questions

### **1. How does the Play It Safe Concussion Care program help my school(s) comply with AB 25 and CIF Bylaw 313?**

AB 25 and Bylaw 313 were implemented to protect youth athletes and ensure a safe return to the playing field and classroom. Play It Safe is a complete concussion care solution that helps facilitate a safe return to play/classroom by combining concussion education, computerized neurocognitive testing, access to medical providers trained in the diagnosis and management of concussion and excess insurance coverage.

### **2. Who purchases the Play It Safe Concussion Care program? The district/school or the individual athlete/family?**

The district/school purchases the program. The district/school identifies the sport(s) and all athletes within that sport are covered by the program. The program is not sold to individual athletes/families.

### **3. Does my district/school have to cover all of their sports/athletes?**

Although it is recommended, the district/school does not have to cover all of their sports. All athletes within a participating sport will be covered.

### **4. How do we know if there is a concussion specialist in our area?**

Wells Fargo and Impact will identify a specialist(s) in your area prior to purchasing the program. Qualified providers can also be located at [impacttest.com/doctors/find](http://impacttest.com/doctors/find).

## **5. How does Excess or Secondary insurance work?**

The excess insurance coverage included in the Play It Safe program is secondary to any primary insurance the athlete may have. Out of pocket co-pays, deductibles or coinsurance can be billed to the excess coverage on a secondary basis. If the athlete does not have primary insurance, or is a MediCal member, the excess coverage acts as primary coverage in these instances.

## **6. Examples of how other districts/schools have paid for the Play It Safe Program.**

Some districts/schools have made Play It Safe a part of their budget, have turned to Booster groups or paid for the program out of the Joint Powers Authority (JPA) fund.

## **7. How much does the Play It Safe program cost?**

The cost breaks down to about \$5.00 per athlete per season of play.
