An innovative approach to concussion care

In order to help ensure a safe return to play for concussed athletes, in 2010 the California Interscholastic Federation implemented Bylaw 313, which states:

"A student-athlete who is suspected of sustaining a concussion or head injury in a practice or game shall be removed from competition at that time for the remainder of the day. A student-athlete who has been removed from play may not return to play until the athlete is evaluated by a licensed health care provider trained in the evaluation and management of concussion and receives written clearance to return to play from that health care provider." With this in mind, Wells Fargo Insurance Services, ImPACT Concussion Management, and the California Interscholastic Federation teamed together to provide schools with a concussion injury management solution. The Play It Safe Concussion Care[™] program is an innovative approach to concussion management that combines concussion awareness, neurocognitive testing, access to medical professionals who are credentialed ImPACT consultants trained in the evaluation and management of concussion, and excess insurance coverage to protect the financial well-being of your athletes and their families.

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How the program works

Recognizing the importance of the health and safety of all your student athletes, your school purchases the The Play It Safe Concussion Care[™] program.

The program promotes concussion awareness by providing informational resources on recognizing these types of injuries and what to do when they occur.

Prior to the start of the season, athletes participate in ImPACT neurocognitive testing to establish a baseline for future reference, should they be concussed at some point during the season.

When an athlete appears to have sustained a concussion, they are pulled from play and evaluated. As needed, they are sent for clinical assessment and specialty care by a medical professional who is a credentialed ImPACT consultant trained in the evaluation and management of concussion.

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The athlete then undergoes a post-injury ImPACT test and evaluation, and the results are compared to their pre-season baseline test. This will assist the medical professional in determining the scope and magnitude of the concussion.

The medical professional provides the athlete with an individual follow-up plan that may include rest, gradual re-exertion, and re-evaluation.

Medical expenses incurred by the athlete while under care of the medical professional, including the post-injury test, are billed to the excess insurance policy, lessening the financial burden to the athlete and their family.

The athlete continues with follow-up care, promoting a safe return-to-play.

Awareness

The Play It Safe Concussion Care[™] program promotes concussion awareness by providing informational resources about:

- Risk factors
- Equipment recommendations
- Early detection signs and symptoms
- Characteristics of the injury
- Care plans

State-of-the-art testing

ImPACT has developed a sophisticated software tool to help sports medicine clinicians evaluate concussion recovery. The ImPACT program is a 20 minute test that is administered pre-season for a baseline result, and again post-injury to track the possible side effects of concussions. The program evaluates multiple aspects of brain function including memory, processing speed, reaction time and post-concussive symptoms. This data helps doctors to make safe return-toplay decisions and may reduce the chances of long-term neurological effects.

Excess insurance coverage

The concussion accident medical insurance policy includes:

- A maximum medical benefit of \$25,000 per injury
- No deductible
- No co-pays
